Mc Clintock, 11th Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles

The statement made by Private R. Mc Clintock No. 15111 was made in his own home in the month of October 1915 but I cannot give exactly the date

I am directed to acquaint you

that it has been represented to this Department that the deceased made a statement in your presence regarding the disposal of his effects in the event of his death, and I am therefore to request that you will be good enough to furnish a statement showing:—

(1) Exactly on what date and at what place the statement referred to was made by the deceased;

(2) The exact words used by him in making the statement;

(3) The full names and addresses of any persons other than yourself, who were present at the time and heard the statement made.

Your statement should be signed by you in the presence of a Magistrate or Minister, or other person holding a similarly responsible position and not interested in the matter, who should be asked to add his name, address and qualification as witness, and to give a certificate showing that, in his opinion, full credit can be given to your statements in the matter.

The words used by him were if any thing should happen to him all his belongings were to go to his mother Anne Mc Clintock
