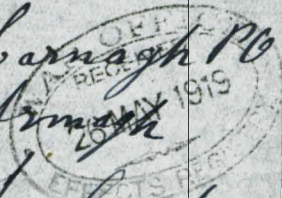

It contained the words "If anything should happen to me all my belongings is to go to my mother." It was inside the Army Pay Book which was of a brown colour made like an envelope.

John M^c Ardle 49 CraignukeSt Wishaw Scotland also saw the will in Sept 1918 when he was last on leave I don't know of any witness to the will. I saw none made & declared before me this 23rd day of May 1919. a Justice of the Peace in & for Co. Armagh
