With reference to your communication regarding the Will of the late No. 4309, Private William Tobin, 1st Battalion, Royal Munster Fusiliers, I am directed to request you to furnish this Department with a statement showing clearly :-

- (1) The words used by the late soldier in making the statement regarding his Will as nearly as you can remember. *What ever I will have left I will leave it to my nephew, L. Tobin*
- (2) On what date and at what place the statement referred to was made by the deceased. *Sept. 8<sup>th</sup>, 1917 at Riversfield*
- (3) The full names and addresses of any persons other than yourself, who were present at the time and heard the statement made. *J. M. Duncy Riversfield John Hennessey*

Your reply should be signed by you in the presence of a Magistrate or Minister to whom you are personally known and who should be asked to certify that full credit can be given to your statements in the matter.
