Sir

I had an interview with Robert Dunlop at his house on Tuesday Evg after receiving your letter. I also saw his daughter. I also saw his wife and the old woman her mother. They all confirmed the statement contained in Mrs Maggie Dunlops letter of the 11th March. That William Murphy when on leave in the early part of Janry 1915 made the statement in their house. They fix the date, after being closely questioned by me that William Murphy came home late on the Sunday Evg. which I find was the 3rd and it was on the Tuesday Evg of that week the statement was made. They also say that William Murphy was no relative of theirs. That he and his sister lived in the same street (I think they said next door) and that his sister - Mary Murphy - now married, lives in Scotland. So that they have no interest whatever in the deceased soldiers effects. The Dunlops seem to be decent working people, and I have no reason whatever to doubt their word. I made the required additions to the letter of 11th March with Maggie Dunlops consent.

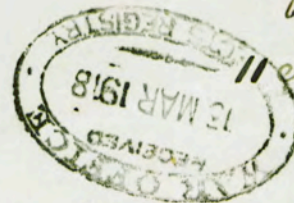
