

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Short Form of Will.	
If a soldier on active service, or under orders for active service, wishes to make a short will, he may do so on the opposite page. It must be in his cwn handwriting and must be signed by and dated. The full names and addresses of the persons whom he desires to benefit, and the sum of money or the articles or property which he desires to leave to them, must be clearly stated.  The following is a specimen of such a will leaving all to one person:—
