

Short Form of Will.

† In the event of my death I give to *My*

(a) Insert name of person to whom it is desired to leave the money or article.

(b) Insert the amount of money or the name of the article which it is wished to give.

* If the soldier desires to mention only one person in his Will this part is to be left blank, if more than two persons, the names and legacies can be added.

† If the Will is executed in Scotland by a Scotsman, the words "In the event, &c.," "and I give to" must be written by the man himself.
